We are elated to share that we will be returning to our worship together this Sunday, May 10, at 10 a.m.!

There will be no Bible classes or evening assembly the first week or two. However, we do plan to continue the audio lessons on our website and video lessons on YouTube (with the link still posted on Facebook) in the evening at 6:00. We plan to meet in the auditorium all together next Wednesday night, May 13. These tentative plans are subject to change as the coronavirus situation continues to evolve. We will continue to monitor the situation. We ask for your continued prayers and prayers for each other in this time.

It will be great to see one another again as we praise and honor our God and Savior together.

There are a few things that we need you to know about our coming together.

- We will be in compliance with the governor's recommendations IF we are willing to maintain "social distancing", i.e. six foot spacing.
- In view of this we ask you to not sit in back to back pews. Every other pew will be "roped off". So, we will have people in every other pew. In addition, we are asking that family units or those who have maintained close social contact sit together. And others please sit six feet apart. Be mindful that you will likely be sitting in an unfamiliar place in the auditorium until things return to normal.
- Huggers and hand shakers please be respectful of others' personal space and their wish to maintain it (and the Governor's). Your time will come—in time.
- Worship should include the things we normally do and should take about the same amount of time.
- Distribution of the Lord's Supper will be different! Please pick up a communion

packet as you enter the auditorium. You will be able to partake of the Lord's Supper at the proper time.

You can then throw away the packet in the foyer or south exits as you leave.

- Our giving will also be different. You may leave your offering in one of the baskets in the foyer or south exits as you leave services. These new ways are to keep us all from handling the same containers over and over again.
- Some who have listened to our services online before we had to go on hiatus have observed that we are always a coughing congregation. Perhaps you would like to bring your own bottled water to prevent any coughing or to help quickly dispel any that starts.
- We do NOT plan on any sort of health screening as people enter the building. But we do ask that if you are sick or have had a fever in the last three days to please stay at home for the sake of others.
- If you are one of those whose health is compromised for whatever reason, we ask you to carefully consider the risk of coming together with so many people. If you are not yet comfortable returning to worship under these circumstances for health reasons, we want you to know that we understand and respect your decision.

We look forward to seeing you this Sunday. If we don't see you, we understand. Things should get better as the state of Missouri opens back up. We're glad it's getting started! "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord'" (Psalm 122:1).
