Yes, that Joseph.

He was a hard worker. He resisted his master's wife. He interpreted the dreams of the cupbearer, the baker, and the Pharaoh himself. He led Egypt through a worldwide famine and equipped Egypt to provide for rest of the earth. He received his starving brothers, showed them mercy, and preserved the would-be nation of Israel through his faithfulness.

Interestingly, Joseph is memorialized in Hebrews 11 for none of these reasons.

Hebrews 11:22

[22] By faith Joseph, at the end of his life, made mention of the exodus of the Israelites and gave directions concerning his bones. (ESV)

Joseph was a shining example of faithfulness to God throughout his entire life. What the New Testament wants us to remember about him, though, is his last words.

Joseph was known to prophecy about the future. In Genesis 50:24-25, Joseph spoke of the future exodus, and he made plans to be a part of it. Joseph's bones were kept in Egypt, reminding the Israelites of their hope beyond slavery, and his bones joined the exodus over 400 years later.

Exodus 13:19

[19] Moses took the bones of Joseph with him, for Joseph had made the sons of Israel solemnly swear, saying, "God will surely visit you, and you shall carry up my bones with you from here." (ESV)

Joseph crossed the Red Sea with the Israelites as they escaped Egypt. Though his spirit had left the earth, his bones were a memorial of faithfulness.

Joseph believed in God's plan for the future, and he made plans to be a part of it.

Do you believe in God's plan for your future? The biblical timeline has one final event yet to occur, an exodus from this world. Have you made plans to be a part of it?

1 Thessalonians 4:16-17

[16] For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. [17] Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord. (ESV)
