Paul couldn't have been more thankful for the people in Thessalonica with fresh faith in Christ. They became Christians when they obeyed the gospel Paul preached (Acts 17:1-4, 1 Thess. 2:13). So he couldn't have been more concerned about threats to their faith.

Three short paragraphs in 1 Thessalonians 2:14-3:5 reflect at least three ways Satan works to separate disciples—young and old—from God.

"¹⁴ For you, brothers, became imitators of the churches of God in Christ Jesus that are in Judea. For you suffered the same things from your own countrymen as they did from the Jews, ¹⁵ who killed both the Lord Jesus and the prophets, and drove us out, and displease God and oppose all mankind ¹⁶by hindering us from speaking to the Gentiles that they might be saved—so as always to fill up the measure of their sins. But wrath has come upon them at last!"

Through people, Satan harasses us. He got into the hearts of a mass of Jews like he did into the heart of Judas. They turned on their countrymen who turned to Jesus, and they pursued his disciples everywhere. Before the baptismal water had hardly dried from the newborn Christians, the devil's minions descended to kill their faith (Acts 17:4-9, 1 Th. 1:6). If he can get people to betray and murder the only perfect man who ever lived, will he have any problem getting people to harass you when you do your best to serve the Lord?

"¹⁷ But since we were torn away from you, brothers, for a short time, in person not in heart, we endeavored the more eagerly and with great desire to see you face to face, ¹⁸ because we wanted to come to you—I, Paul, again and again—but Satan hindered us. ¹⁹ For what is our

hope or joy or crown of boasting before our Lord Jesus at his coming? Is it not you? For you are our glory and joy."

Through circumstances, Satan hinders us. He was able to set up a roadblock to keep Paul from getting back to these people who meant so much to him. When things are on track for us spiritually, he will look for a way to derail us. When we are struggling but determined to repent, he will give us opportunity and incentive to keep sinning. When we want to help someone else, he will try to stop it.

"¹ Therefore when we could bear it no longer, we were willing to be left behind at Athens alone, ² and we sent Timothy, our brother and God's coworker in the gospel of Christ, to establish and exhort you in your faith, ³ that no one be moved by these afflictions. For you yourselves know that we are destined for this. ⁴ For when we were with you, we kept telling you beforehand that we were to suffer affliction, just as it has come to pass, and just as you know. ⁵ For this reason, when I could bear it no longer, I sent to learn about your faith, for fear that somehow the tempter had tempted you and our labor would be in vain."

Through feelings, Satan disheartens us. Being a Christian won't make life trouble free (John 16:33, Acts 14:22). In fact, it creates a whole new set of problems. But they are problems worth enduring. The tempter wants to use your trials to extinguish your faith. God wants to use them to establish your faith. Will you let God have his way?

Don't be outwitted by Satan; we are not ignorant of his designs (2 Cor. 2:11).
