Christians have our own vocabulary to illustrate the richness of our salvation. Many of these words are ones we would never use in daily conversation, but they are valuable to a full understanding of God's love for us. The following definitions are from The Zondervan Pictorial Bible Dictionary.

Atonement – Root meaning in English, “at-one-ment”: i.e. the bringing together of two who have been enemies into a relationship of peace and friendship.

This word appears often throughout the Old Testament, but only once in the New Testament. Translators have been faithful to the original meaning of the word when they translate the Greek word for “atonement” as “reconciliation” in Romans 5:10-11. Thank God that Christ allows former enemies to be called his friends!

Reconciliation – Reconciliation is a change of relationship between God and man based on the changed status of man through the redemptive work of Christ.

Read what Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 5:16-21 to know how our being “a new creation” changes not only our relationship with our creator but how it also changes our relationships with every person in the world!

Justification – That judicial act of God, by which, on the basis of the meritorious work of Christ, imputed to the sinner and received by him through faith, He declares the sinner absolved from his sin, released from its penalty, and restored as righteous.

Read Romans 4:1-8 and try to wrap your mind around the work of God! We cannot comprehend

the extremes to which our sins are forgiven, so we trust the one who justifies.

Propitiation – The English word “propitiation” is of Latin derivation, and signifies an objective “provision” for “pity,” or mercy.

1 John 2:2-3 uses the word “propitiation” to highlight the breadth of Christ's sacrifice (for the whole world) and those who benefit from it (those who keep his commandments).

Redemption – Rooted in the secular usage of the word, the NT doctrine of redemption draws its meaning from a parallel with the marketplace concept “to buy back,”... the word is used in the New Testament to contain both the idea of deliverance and the price of that deliverance, or ransom.

He paid a debt he did not owe. I owed a debt I could not pay. Though you will not find the word redemption in 1 Peter 1:18-19, it spells out plainly the wonderful redemption experience for those who are in Christ.

Sanctification – [Sanctification's] fundamental force [is] to separate from the world and consecrate to God. To sanctify anything is to declare that it belongs to God.

It was Jesus' prayer for his disciples and for us that we would be sanctified in the truth (John 17:17-20), separated from the world by our love for God's word. As we continue to study God's word, let's believe what God says about our salvation, and let's live faithfully for him!


There will be a **Parents' Meeting** for parents of teens in grades 7-12 tonight after evening worship in the upstairs room of the activities center.
