Jesus truly saw the needs of people! If we are children of God, we are to be imitators of Christ. Peter said in Acts 10:38 that Jesus went about doing good. Part of that was the miraculous healing of the sick. This we cannot imitate. There are, however, many things that we read about concerning Christ that we can and should imitate, like the events in Mark 6:34.

“When Jesus went ashore, He saw a large crowd, and He felt compassion for them because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and He began to teach them many things.”

Jesus’ eyes were wide open to the needs of those around Him. He did not hurriedly rush by these people as if He just didn’t have time. The needs of others impacted Him, causing Him to stop what He was doing and where He was going. The observance of the needs of the multitude moved Him to compassion. His compassion was a result of the fact that these people were like sheep without a shepherd. Sheep without a shepherd have no leader, provider, defender, and guide. They are LOST! His compassion did not stop with just a feeling. His compassion translated into action.

Jesus saw their greatest need was to be taught, so He taught them. Jesus was not unmoved by the physical needs of people, since shortly He would miraculously feed this hungry multitude. He also sympathized with those who were suffering with illnesses, both Jew and Greek. But the ultimate level of His compassion rested in the great-

Surely we are not above Him are we? Jesus lived what He preached. His life reflected the sheep in the judgment scene He talks about in Matt. 25:31-46 where the sheep and the goats are separated based on the service shown to others in need.

Love for the Lord means compassion for others. Compassion for others equals action taken on their behalf and for their own good.
