Years ago, *Reader's Digest* published a true story about Cameron Mounger. As he left work one morning, he noticed a man waving from inside an old yellow Dodge in the parking lot. A couple of days later, Cameron realized that the car had not moved. The man had been sitting in his car for three days in terrible cold and snow! He had arrived in Fort Worth, where Cameron lived, three days before he was to begin a new job. For those three days he had no money or food.

Reluctantly, the man asked to borrow a dollar for a snack to tide him over until the next day. Cameron regretfully explained that he was broke. Having lost his job some time earlier, he was working a part-time job, and he and his wife were eating outdated frozen dinners which a friend intercepted as they were headed for a supermarket's dumpster.

Cameron walked to his car, wishing he could have helped. Then he remembered a special dollar bill buried deep in his wallet. He took it out, admiring it one last time, then walked back to the old yellow Dodge and gave it to the hungry man. The man was puzzled as to why the dollar bill was covered with writing, but he accepted it with gratitude. He didn't recognize the autographs Cameron had collected on the bill backstage at the final performance of the Grand Ole Opry at the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville before the show moved

to a new home. Cameron's last dollar meant so much more than its buying power, but someone else needed it.

Like the hungry man, none of us completely understand what was given up for us. Jesus loved us so much that, "though he was in the form of God, (he) did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross" (Phil. 2:6-8).

Having demonstrated that kind of love (1 John 3:16), the Lord calls his disciples to give everything they have, love, and are to Him (Luke 9:26-27). He reminds us that we serve him by doing good even to those whom we consider the "least" (Matt. 25:40). "...Thereby some have entertained angels unawares" (Heb. 13:2).

When Jesus had given himself for us, "God highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name" (Phil. 2:9). He promises us that when a person surrenders all to him, "he shall receive a hundredfold now in this time...and in the world to come eternal life" (Mark 10:29-30).

Lord, help us to surrender all!
