Most of my Easter memories are of a hotel room or a long drive home. From the age of four-years-old, I've been involved with Lads to Leaders whose annual convention always falls on Easter weekend. I still remember the Easter bunny statue at the bottom of a staircase in Nashville's Opryland Hotel, the small village of shops surrounded by a wall of hotel balconies, and the room I gave my first speech in.

Of all the great memories we may have, no greater scene deserves our memory as does the resurrection of Christ. Paul wrote that Christ's death, burial, resurrection, and appearance to the saints is of "first importance" to our faith (1 Cor 15:3). His resurrection to life is the reason we gather every Sunday. His resurrection to life is the reason that we live! His resurrection to life is the reason we train young people in his service and the reason we ourselves are continually transformed.

I'd like to share with you something I read this week from Jim McGuiggan.

Nikolai Ivanovich Bukharin, Communist propogandist and leader in the revolution, was sent from Moscow to Kiev in the early 1920s to address a vast anti-God rally orchestrated by the state. For an hour, he harangued the people, using ridicule, abuse, and argument. Silence reigned when he stepped down. Questions were invited. A priest of the Russian Orthodox Church, one of the many sufferers, asked to speak and was given permission.

He stood beside the Bukharin, faced the vast assembly, and gave the ancient liturgical Easter greeting, "Christ is risen." Immediately the whole assembly rose to its feet, and the reply came back like the thunderous pounding of a great wave against a cliff: "He is risen indeed."

When the arguments have been made, when the pain has spoken, when the heartache devastates to silence or madness, there still remains a fact, a truth, a Person: the resurrected Jesus Christ.
